The Greater Washington Partnership is seeking a Workforce and Strategic Initiatives Associate to develop and implement the organization's range of strategic initiatives, with the role particularly focused on workforce development in the Capital Region. As a member of a fast paced, high-energy team, this individual will have day-to-day responsibility for various aspects of the Partnership's skills and talent agenda and additionally will contribute towards the advancement of other Partnership initiatives.

Specific Responsibilities

- Develop and execute the Partnership's "digital tech talent" initiatives, with emphases on higher education-business partnerships and secondary-to-postsecondary STEM pathways. Activities will include:
 - Establishing and maintaining relationships with industry, education and workforce leaders.
 - Analyzing labor market and education data, trends and outcomes to develop actionable insights and recommendations.
 - Researching effective practices and policies to inform the Partnership's talent strategies and initiatives.
 - Evaluating state and local education and workforce policy, as needed, and developing Partnership's policy position.
 - Drafting research and policy briefs, social media content, and presentation materials.
- Support the development and implementation of other potential Strategic Initiative priority areas, including new topics and new ideas to drive the Partnership's ongoing issue-oriented agenda.
- Serve as a thought partner and engage in team problem solving across strategic initiatives.
- Provide project management within and across projects.
- Support the Partnership's communications strategies to elevate awareness and prioritization of talent and skills development and other economic growth drivers in the region.
- Represent the Partnership with Board member organizations and external stakeholders.

Qualifications and Experience

- Professional experience in a role requiring project coordination and analytical problem solving, ideally in post-secondary education, and/or workforce development
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- Results-oriented individual, with a proven track record of achievement across both professional and educational experiences
- Proven ability to handle multiple assignments simultaneously

Description of Organization
